


Guide to Correct Wiring for Livestock Buildings

The *National Electrical Code* requires the use of uniquely different wiring materials for livestock and poultry buildings. The harsh and corrosive conditions within animal buildings means that “residential grade” electrical boxes, light fixtures, cable and related components will deteriorate prematurely. This could interrupt power to critical ventilation fans, create electrical hazards for humans and animals, or even a cause a devastating fire.

Excessive moisture is present in swine barns, horse facilities, poultry houses, and enclosed cattle barns. Even more damaging are corrosive manure gases which can attack metal wiring components and cause premature failure.



Don't gamble on improper wiring in your barn!




A third factor is dust, which must be excluded from electrical boxes and light fixtures. The correct type of electrical enclosures must be used anywhere there is dust from hay, poultry feathers, feed particles and other sources. Using inadequate electrical wiring materials and methods can jeopardize the electrical system.
